Subject: Senate Summary: Reproducibility and Closing 2015-2016 Senate Term

The final Academic Senate resolution I'd like to bring to your attention endorsed a proposal made by our Joint Provost/Senate Committee on Research, focusing on reproducibility in scientific research (attached). Many of you have been following the national discourse on this subject, and others of you have already seen funding sources begin to require more explicit explanations of safeguards to be used to validate findings. The resolution calls on USC to be at the vanguard of that movement, creating our own set of standards and guidelines that explicitly demonstrate our community's commitment to replication and verification of research findings. The attached document also lists a number of journal articles that address this issue in depth.
