Its faculty conduct ground breaking research in 16 understanding the dynamics and impact of these factors, nationally and globally. Its educational programs develop leaders working for change in this area across many social environments. It is a 17 18 leader in its role as a highly selective research university, with its record of successful recruitment and 19 support of first-generation, transfer, and international students, and has a very diverse undergraduate 20 student body. It partners with the community with funding and programs that help to address these 21 issues in its own neighborhood, which is itself a culturally and economically diverse community, and 22 23 WHEREAS, The USC Provost is committed to this issue, making Access and Opportunity globally, as 24 well as for all of our students, staff, and faculty, one of the pillars of USC's new strategic plan, and 25 26 WHEREAS, Despite USC's leadership on this issue in various parts of the university, there is not yet a 27 centralized plan for making Access and Opportunity a system-wide reality for those who live and work 28 on campus, nor is there yet a plan for communicating to the world outside USC its commitment to these 29 goals, from its recruitment and campus climate practices, to its research or initiatives to make national 30 and global impact on Access and Opportunity. 31 32 Therefore, Be it RESOLVED, That the Academic Senate endorses the proposal submitted by the Senate 33 Campus Climate Committee, outlining the latest thinking on Access and Opportunity in higher 34 education, as well as a review of the practices of our peer institutions, along with a set of 35 recommendations to our Provost on improving Access and Opportunity on our own campus.
