21	<b>Call to Order</b> – Ginger Clark, Academic Senate President called the meeting to order at 2:02 pm
22	
23	Approval of November and December Senate meetings draft minutes
24	The November meeting minutes were approved. The December meeting minutes were amended
25	to reflect that the first read of the part-time faculty resolution was preempted by the Part-Time
26	Faculty Committee report that served as the catalyst for the resolution. The amended meeting
27	minutes were also approved.
28	
29	Dialogue with Provost Quick
30	Provost Quick reported on joint visits to the School of Gerontology and Marshall School of
31	Business with President Clark and Vice President Cannon. More visits to each of the 19 schools
32	are welcome. The provost also took questions from the floor.
33	
34	Update on Undergraduate Admissions: The admissions deadline for 2016-2017 was Friday,
35	January 15. An estimated 54,000 applications were submitted for 2,700 first-year slots for
36	undergrads, which will produce an estimated admission rate of 16% admission rate, making USC
37	about as selective as the Ivy Leagues. Graduate admissions numbers are forthcoming.

39	Unionization Update: Three units are voting right now through January 29 <sup>th</sup> – Roski, Dornsife
40	College, and the new USC International Academy. Together the three units comprise ~500
41	faculty (little less than 10% of faculty – we are about 6800 faculty right now). Provost Quick
42	that some issues of faculty governance must remain in a holding pattern because of the
43	requirements of the unionization process.
44	
45	Campus Climate Update: To follow up on Provost Quick's memo on access and opportunity
46	from last semester, several additional programs were announced:
47	• The first of campus forum series on diversity, access, and opportunity will be held today
48	at 7:30 pm in Doheny Library
49	• A Diversity Task Force co-chaired by Varun Soni and Ainsley Carry has been appointed
50	• All deans have been asked to name at least one Diversity Liaison from each school who
51	can work and coordinate with the team in the Provost's Office. The Provost's Office will
52	also hold a retreat in the summer before the new school year of the diversity liaisons, etc.
53	• Have created a new website: <u>http://diversity.usc.edu/</u> that has been launched (in beta) and
54	will continue to be improved.

57	First Read, Resolution 15/16-004: Proposal on Change in Part-Time Faculty
58	Policies and Practices
59	Discussion of the resolution, which is a response to the part-time faculty committee report.
60	Feedback was solicited following the distribution to the Faculty Councils with the intention of huilding a conservation the resolution for passage. Should the resolution pass it will

66	revise and resubmit and then bring it back to the Executive Board, which will then bring it back

70	Professor Clark presented the notion that the pending unionization efforts will have an effect on
71	the Senate's ability to represent the faculty in the units that successfully unionize.
